**Safe Spring Cleaning:
A Friendly Reminder from Your Fire Department**



Spring cleaning is the perfect time to open the windows, clear out the clutter, and rediscover items you forgot you owned. Whether your cleaning style is inspired by Marie Kondo or feng shui, spring cleaning is also a great opportunity to take care of a few simple things that can help prevent fires in the home.

Start with dryer lint and household dust. Clean the lint trap regularly and check dryer vents for buildup. Lint may look harmless, but it's surprisingly flammable.

As you declutter, keep an eye on what's stored near heat sources. Paper, cardboard, and other combustibles should stay at least three feet away from heaters, furnaces, and water heaters. In garages and sheds, store gasoline and other flammable liquids in approved containers and away from ignition sources.

Take a moment to check cords and outlets. If cords are frayed or power strips are overloaded, it's time for an upgrade. Extension cords are handy, but they're not meant to be permanent residents.

Finally, test your smoke alarms and replace batteries as needed. If your alarms are more than 10 years old, it's time to replace them. A working smoke alarm is loud, persistent, and exactly what you want in an emergency.

A clean home is a safer home. Adding a few fire-safety checks to your spring-cleaning routine is a simple way to protect your family, your property, and your peace of mind.

Important Update to Online Payments

Please be aware that Tyler Payments, our online payment portal, has implemented a new security measure that verifies the ZIP code entered at checkout against the ZIP code on file with your card-issuing financial institution.



Because ZIP codes were not previously validated, some customers using saved payment methods or making one-time payments may experience a declined transaction if the ZIP code entered does not exactly match the one associated with their card.

To avoid any issues, we recommend logging into your online portal and confirming that the ZIP code on file matches the ZIP code your bank has for your card.
